AWARNING

- Do not allow persons to operate or assemble the product until they have read this manual and have developed a thorough understanding of how it works.
- Do not modify this product in any way. Unauthorized modification may impair the function and/or safety and could affect the life of the product. There are specific applications for which the product was designed.
- Use the right fan for the job. DO NOT attempt to force small equipment to do the work of larger industrial equipment. There are certain applications for which this equipment was designed. It will do the job better and more safely at the capacity for which it was intended. DO NOT use this equipment for a purpose for which it was not intended.
- Industrial or commercial applications must follow OSHA requirements.

AWARNING

WORK AREA SAFETY

- Do not use the product where there is a risk of causing a fire or an explosion; e.g., in the presence of flammable liquids, gases, or dust. The product can create sparks, which may ignite the flammable liquids, gases, or dust.
- Do not allow the air curtain to come into contact with an electrical source. The air curtain is not insulated and contact will cause electrical shock.
- Keep children and bystanders away from the work area while operating the air curtain. Do not allow children to handle the air curtain.
- Be aware of all power lines, electrical circuits, water pipes, and other mechanical hazards in your work area. Some of these hazards may be hidden from your view and may cause personal injury and/or property damage if contacted.

AWARNING

PERSONAL SAFETY

- Stay alert, watch what you are doing, and use common sense when operating the air curtain. Do not use the air curtain while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol, or medication. A moment of inattention while operating the air curtain may result in serious personal injury.
- Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing, dangling objects, or jewelry. Keep your hair, clothing
 and gloves away from moving parts. Loose clothes, jewelry, or long hair can be caught in moving
 parts. Air vents on the air curtain often cover moving parts and should be avoided.
- Wear the proper personal protective equipment when necessary. Use ANSI Z87.1 compliant safety goggles (not safety glasses) with side shields, or when needed, a face shield. Use a dust mask in dusty work conditions. Also use non-skid safety shoes, hardhat, gloves, dust collection systems, and hearing protection when appropriate. This applies to all persons in the work area.
- Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times.
- Do not use the air curtain when tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication.
- Ensure the power switch is off prior to plugging in the air curtain.

AWARNING

ELECTRICAL SAFETY

- Grounded products must be plugged into an outlet properly installed and grounded in accordance
 with all codes and ordinances. Never remove the grounding prong or modify the plug in any way.
 Do not use any adapter plugs. Check with a qualified electrician if you are in doubt as to whether
 the outlet is properly grounded. If the products should electrically malfunction or break down,
 grounding provides a low resistance path to carry electricity away from the user.
- Double insulated tools are equipped with a polarized plug (one blade is wider than the other). This
 plug will fit in a polarized outlet only one way. If the plug does not fit fully in the outlet, reverse the
 plug. If it still does not fit, contact a qualified electrician to install a polarized outlet. Do not change
 the plug in any way. Double insulation eliminates the need for the three wire grounded power cord
 and grounded power supply system.
- Do not allow the product to come into contact with an electrical source. The air curtain is not insulated and contact will cause electrical shock.
- Avoid body contact with grounded surfaces such as pipes, radiators, ranges, and refrigerators.
 There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is grounded.
- Do not expose the air curtain to rain or wet conditions. Water entering an air curtain will increase
 the risk of electric shock.
- Do not abuse the power cord. Never use the power cord to carry the air curtain or pull the plug
 from an outlet. Keep the power cord away from heat, oil, sharp edges, or moving parts. Replace
 damaged power cords immediately. Damaged power cords increase the risk of electric shock.

ACAUTION

FAN USE AND CARE

- Check for damaged parts before each use. Carefully check that the fan will operate properly and perform its intended function. Replace damaged or worn parts immediately. Never operate the fan with a damaged part.
- Do not use a fan with a malfunctioning switch. Any fan that cannot be controlled with the power switch is dangerous and must be repaired by an authorized service representative before using.
- Disconnect the power from the fan and place the switch in the locked or off position before
 making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing the fan. Such preventive safety
 measures reduce the risk of starting the fan accidentally.
- Store the fan when it is not in use. Store it in a dry, secure place out of the reach of children. Inspect the fan for good working condition prior to storage and before re-use.
- Keep guards in place and in working order. Never operate the fan without the guards in place.
- Do not leave the fan running unattended.

AWARNING

- Electric shock hazard. Do not expose to water or rain.
- Be sure equipment is properly grounded.
- Use only outdoor-rated extension cords of proper size.
- Do not use this product with any solid-state speed control device.
- Rotating Blade Hazard. Can cause serious injury or cut. Keep hands clear.

Grounding

AWARNING


- This machine must be grounded while in use to protect the operator from electrical shock. This
 drill press is equipped with an electrical cord that has an equipment grounding conductor and a
 grounding plug. The plug MUST be plugged into a matching receptacle that is properly installed
 and grounded in accordance with ALL local codes and ordinances.
- DO NOT MODIFY THE PROVIDED PLUG. If it will not fit the receptacle, have the proper receptacle installed by a qualified electrician.
- CHECK with a qualified electrician or service person if you do not completely understand the grounding instructions, or if you are not sure the air curtain is properly grounded.

Grounded Tools: Tools with 3-Prong Plugs

Tools marked with **Grounding Required** have a 3-wire cord and 3-prong grounding plug. The plug must be connected to a properly grounded outlet. If the tool should electrically malfunction or break down, grounding provides a low resistance path to carry electricity away from the user, reducing the risk of electric shock. (See Figure A.)

The grounding prong in the plug is connected through the green wire inside the cord to the grounding system in the tool. The green wire in the cord must be the only wire connected to the tool's grounding system and must never be attached to an electrically live terminal.

Your tool must be plugged into an appropriate outlet, properly installed and grounded in accordance with all codes and ordinances. The plug and outlet should look like those in the following illustration.



Double Insulated Tools: Tools with Two-Prong Plugs

Tools marked **Double Insulated** do not require grounding. They have a special double insulation system which satisfies OSHA requirements and complies with the applicable standards of Underwriters Laboratories, Inc., the Canadian Standard Association, and the National Electrical Code. (See Figure B.)

Double insulated tools may be used in either of the 120 volt outlets shown in the following illustration.



Extension Cords

AWARNING


- USE A PROPER EXTENSION CORD. Make sure your extension cord is in good condition. When
 using an extension cord, be sure to use one heavy enough to carry the current your product will
 draw. An undersized cord will cause a drop in line voltage, resulting in loss of power and cause
 overheating.
- Be sure your extension cord is properly wired and in good condition. Always replace a damaged extension cord or have it repaired by a qualified person before using it. Protect your extension cords from sharp objects, excessive heat and damp or wet areas.
- Grounded tools require a 3-wire extension cord. Double Insulated tools can use either a 2- or 3wire extension cord.
- As the distance from the supply outlet increases, you must use a heavier gauge extension cord.
 Using extension cords with inadequately sized wire causes a serious drop in voltage, resulting in loss of power and possible tool damage.
- The smaller the gauge number of the wire, the greater the capacity of the cord. For example, a
 14-gauge cord can carry a higher current than a 16-gauge cord. Minimum extension cord wire
 size is shown in the following table:

- When using more than one extension cord to make up the total length, make sure each cord contains at least the minimum wire size required.
- If you are using one extension cord for more than one tool, add the nameplate amperes and use the sum to determine the required minimum cord size.
- If you are using an extension cord outdoors, make sure it is marked with the suffix **W-A** (**W** in Canada) to indicate it is acceptable for outdoor use.
- Make sure your extension cord is properly wired and in good electrical condition. Always replace a damaged extension cord or have it repaired by a qualified electrician before using it.
- Protect your extension cords from sharp objects, excessive heat, and damp or wet areas.




INSTALLATION METHOD:

WARNING: INSTALLATION AND ELECTRICAL CONNECTION MUST BE PERFORMED BY QUALIFIED TECHNICIAN.


- 1) Fastener bag:
- 6 sets of (M8X60L) fastening bolts, spring washers, and (M8) nuts.
- 2). Check to ensure the voltage/frequency on rating label is compliant with the local power source before use.
- 3) Follow the diagram (AT RIGHT) for installation position
- 4) Coverage height: 99 inches (For horizontal air curtain installation)
- 5) Installation on concrete wall:
- A. Take off INSTALLATION PLATE (unscrew the FIXING SCREWS)




- B. Install INSTALLATION PLATE on the wall:
- -Fix position of installation
- -Insert FIXING BOLT(S) and fill with cement for consolidation
- After cement solidifies, install INSTALLATION PLATE on FIXING BOLT(S) and fasten it with WASHER(S), SPRING WASHER(S), and NUT(S). (See diagram on right)



- -Insure INSTALLATION PLATE is mounted securely.
- C. Install **BODY of Unit**. Hang up **BODY of Unit** onto the INSTALLATION PLATE.

Check to insure it is secure, and then tighten the FIXING SCREWS.



IMPORTANT: The recommended distance between 2 adjacent sets of air curtain is to be 1-2 inches.


Before Each Use

Be sure fan housing has not been opened or damaged.

Operating Instructions

- 1) Connect electric power
- 2) Press the keystroke of OFF, LO, HIGH on the switch to set speed to OFF, LO and HIGH Press relevant function key stroke for remote controlling unit

3) Adjust air direction louvers to preferred positions (according to arrow in the following diagram)



Maintenance

- 1) Install onto firm surface firm
- 2) Do not install air curtain in locations with exposure to water or with permanent exposure to high temperature and places close to explosive and corrosive gases.
- 3) Have reliable grounding set when in use.
- 4) In case of damage or breakdown, consult a qualified technician
- 5) Clean air curtain periodically (see instructions below).

Maintain your air curtain. It is recommended that the general condition of any fan be examined before it is used. Keep your fan in good repair by adopting a program of conscientious repair and maintenance in accordance with the recommended procedures found in this manual.

- 1. Depending on the usage and severity, a regularly scheduled inspection should be established.
- 2. Check for unusual noises when circulator is running.
- 3. Periodically inspect and tighten all bolts, screws and set screws.


AWARNING

Unplug from electrical supply before cleaning.

Cleaning

- 1. Use a soft, damp cloth (water only) for cleaning, then wipe with dry cloth.
- 2. Don't not use cleaners that harm paints or plastics (i.e., bleach or ammonia).
- 3. Do not bend blades.

This limited warranty is not transferable.
