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Intended Use

This tow-behind 40" Dethatcher helps prevent roots, leaves, grass clippings, and other small vegetation from inhibiting the growth of your lawn. The Dethatcher has 20 oil-tempered, spring tines that comb the matter layer of thatch onto the surface where it can be easily bagged or mulched.

WORK AREA SAFETY

- Be aware of all power lines, electrical circuits, water pipes, and other mechanical hazards in your work area. Some of these hazards may be hidden from your view and may cause personal injury and/or property damage if contacted.

AWARNING

PERSONAL SAFETY

- Stay alert, watch what you are doing, and use common sense when operating the tool. Do not use the tool while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol, or medication. A moment of inattention while operating the tool may result in serious personal injury.
- Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing, dangling objects, or jewelry. Keep your hair, clothing and gloves away from moving parts. Loose clothes, jewelry, or long hair can be caught in moving parts. Air vents on the tool often cover moving parts and should be avoided.

- Do not force the dethatcher. Dethatchers do a better and safer job when used in the manner for which they are designed. Plan your work and use the correct dethatcher for the job.
- Check for damaged parts before each use. Carefully check that the dethatcher will operate
 properly and perform its intended function. Replace damaged or worn parts immediately. Never
 operate the dethatcher with a damaged part.
- Store the dethatcher when it is not in use. Store it in a dry, secure place out of the reach of children. Inspect the dethatcher for good working condition prior to storage and before re-use.
- Use only accessories that are recommended by the manufacturer for use with your dethatcher.
 Accessories that may be suitable for one dethatcher may create a risk of injury when used with another dethatcher.
- Do not leave the dethatcher or tow vehicle running unattended.
- Inspect the dethatcher for damage or excessive wear before each use. If you find damage, do not use the dethatcher.

Specific Operation Warnings

AWARNING

- Lower equipment to ground, stop engine, remove key and set brake before dismounting tractor.
- DO NOT use if equipment is damaged. Repair equipment before continuing use.
- DO NOT exceed this implement's maximum speed of 5 MPH. Exceeding this speed may result in loss of control during transport or braking.
- Keep seat belt securely fastened while operating. Falling off can result in impalement or being run over.
- If equipped, parking stands must be functional, kept in good repair, and stored on the unit. Park and store on a hard, level surface.
- Operate from tractor seat only.
- Never allow riders on equipment.
- Keep bystanders at least 20 feet away while operating.
- Sharp points can cause injury. Be cautious when replacing tines.
- Store out of reach of children. Not for use by or around children.

FALLING OFF CAN RESULT IN IMPALEMENT OR BEING RUN OVER

- Tractor must be equipped with Roll Over Protection Structure (or ROPS CAB) and seat belt. Keep foldable ROPS system in "locked up" position at all times.

Assembly

Tools Required:


- 2 1/2" wrenches
- 1 3/4" wrench
- 1 9/16" wrench
- 1 Medium pliers

Step 1: Attach lift plate to main body

Step 1 Hardware Needed:

- 4 Bolt 5/16" x 1" (19)
- 4 Lock Nut 5/16" (18)

Attach Lift Plate (8) to Main Body (6) using Bolts (19) and Lock Nuts (18). Tighten bolts fully. See Step 1.




Step 2: Attach angle brackets to main body

Step 1 Hardware Needed:

- 6 Bolt 5/16" x 1" (19)
- 6 Lock Nut 5/16" (18)

Turn over the main body as shown in Step 2. Attach four Short Angle Brackets (12) and two Hitch Arm Brackets (1) into the round holes in the back row of holes, using Bolts (19) and Lock Nuts (18). Refer to Step 2 for bolt locations.




Step 2

Step 3: Attach hitch mount arms to angle brackets

Step 3 Hardware Needed:

- 4 Bolt 5/16" x 1" (19)
- 4 Lock Nut 5/16" (18)

Attach each of the Hitch Arms (7) to the outside of the angle brackets, using Bolts (19) and Lock Nuts (18). .
See Step 3 for hitch arm locations.
Do not fully tighten bolts.


Step 4: Attach Hitch Brackets

Step 4 Hardware Needed:

2 - Bolt 5/16" x 1-1/4" (22)

2 - Lock Nut 5/16" (18)

Attach the Hitch Bracket(2) to the two Hitch Arms(7) using Bolts (22) and Lock Nuts (18). Do not tighten at this point. See Step 4.



Step 4

Step 5: Fully tighten bolts in the following order

Step 5 Hardware Needed:

1 – Hitch Pin (23)

1 – Cotter Pin (24)

Fully tighten bolts in the order listed below:

- 1. Front hitch arm bolts in Step 4.
- 2. Hitch arm bracket bolts in Step 5.
- 3. All angle bracket bolts from Step 2.
- 4. All angle bracket bolts from Step 3.
- 5. Insert Hitch Pin (23) into the hitch pin brackets as shown in Step 4.
- 6. Insert the Cotter Pin (24) into the hitch pin to hold in place.

Step 6: Attach axle bracket to main body

Step 6 Hardware Needed:


2 - Bolt 5/16" x 1" (19)

2 - Lock Nut 5/16" (18)

Attach the Axle Bracket (9) to the outside of the Short Angle Brackets, using Bolts (19) and Lock Nuts (18).

See Step 6.

Tighten to snug fit, so that the Axle Bracket (4) can move up and down.



Step 6

Step 7: Attach the wheels


Step 7 Hardware Needed:

2 – Shoulder Bolt (11)

2 - Lock Nut (13)

Attach each Wheel (5) using a Shoulder Bolt (11) and Lock Nut (13). Tighten the bolts.

Note: Only tighten the bolts to the end of the threads. The Wheels (5) need to spin freely on the bolts. See Step 7.



Step 7

Step 8: Attach spring tines to the main body


Step 8 Hardware Needed:

10 - Bolt 5/16" x 1" (19)

10 - Flat Washer (14)

10 - Lock Nut 5/16" (18)

Attach each Spring Tine (3) using a Bolt (19), Flat Washer (14), and Lock Nut (18). See Step 8 for the position of the tine. The Tine should sit between the metal bumps on main body. Fully tighten.



Step 9: Attach lift handle

Step 9 Hardware Needed: 3 – Bolt 5/16" x 1" (19) 3 – Lock Nut 5/16" (18)

Turn dethatcher upright onto the tines and wheels.


Attach Tall Angle Bracket (25) to the Axle Bracket (9) using Bolt (19) and Lock Nut (18). Do not tighten.

Next, position the Lift Handle (10) through the Lift Plate (8) on the Main Body.

Attach the Lift Handle (10) to the Tall Angle Bracket (1) using Bolt (19) and Lock Nut (18).

Now tighten all bolts in this step.

See Step 9.




Step 9

Step 10: Adjust to towing vehicle

Note: Make sure you are on a level surface when making this adjustment. See Step 10.

Attach the fully assembled dethatcher to the towing vehicle. Next, lower the Lift Arm to place the dethatcher in operating position. Adjust the bolts at the back of the mounting arms until the front and back rows of tines equally touch the ground. Re-tighten carriage bolts.

Note: Adjustment must be changed for each towing vehicle.



Step 10

Before Each Use

Check that all connections are tight before each use. Weight may be added to the top of the main body. Secure added weight to the main body.

Operating Instructions

WARNING: Do not operate this dethatcher above 5 mph.


After Each Use

Lubricate the wheels and wheel shoulder bolts regularly as needed. Store in a dry place away from moisture or water to avoid rusting.

Maintenance

Maintain your dethatcher. It is recommended that the general condition of any dethatcher be examined before it is used. Keep your dethatcher in good repair by adopting a program of conscientious repair and maintenance in accordance with the recommended procedures found in this manual. Keep all cutting tools sharp and clean. Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges are less likely to bind and are easier to control. Keep handles dry, clean, and free from oil and grease.


Parts Diagram


Parts Diagram

If the product does not comply with this limited warranty, Your sole and exclusive remedy is that We will, at our sole option and within a commercially reasonable time, either replace the product or product component without charge to You or refund the purchase price (less shipping). This limited warranty is not transferable.

Limitations on the Warranty
