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Intended Use

The Ultra-Tow 800 Lb. Capacity Trailer Dolly has a three-wheel design which makes maneuvering trailers easier than with two-wheel models. The versatile design features flat-free tires and an adjustable height for many different trailer tongue heights.

WORK AREA SAFETY

- Inspect the work area before each use. Keep work area clean, dry, free of clutter, and well-lit. Cluttered, wet, or dark work areas can result in injury. Using the product in confined work areas may put you dangerously close to cutting tools and rotating parts.
- Do not allow the product to come into contact with an electrical source. The tool is not insulated and contact will cause electrical shock.
- Keep children and bystanders away from the work area while operating the tool. Do not allow

PERSONAL SAFETY

Use a dust mask in dusty work conditions. Also use non-skid safety shoes, hardhat, gloves, dust collection systems, and hearing protection when appropriate. - Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times.
- Secure the work with clamps or a vise instead of your hand when practical. This safety precaution allows for proper tool operation using both hands.

DOLLY USE AND CARE

- Do not force the dolly. Products are safer and do a better job when used in the manner for which they are designed. Plan your work, and use the correct product for the job.
- Check for damaged parts before each use. Carefully check that the product will operate properly and perform its intended function. Replace damaged or worn parts immediately. Never operate the product with a damaged part.
- Store the dolly when it is not in use. Store it in a dry, secure place out of the reach of children. Inspect the tool for good working condition prior to storage and before re-use.
- Use only accessories that are recommended by the manufacturer for use with your product. Accessories that may be suitable for one product may create a risk of injury when used with another tool. Never use an accessory that has a lower operating speed or operating pressure than the tool itself.

- Always keep arms, feet and legs out from under the trailer tongue while hitching, unhitching or moving the trailer.
- Wear ANSI Z87.1 safety goggles during use.
- Always make sure the loaded trailer is chocked properly before moving the dolly into place.
- Maintain proper tire pressure at all times. DO NOT over inflate tire. Over inflation may cause the tire to burst or the rim to separate, causing serious personal injury.
- Be sure the trailer tongue is securely connected to the trailer dolly coupler ball before unlocking and moving the trailer. Use best judgment to prevent sudden uncontrolled movement of the trailer once it is connected.
- NEVER LEAVE a dolly under load unattended.
- Always check for damaged or worn parts before using the dolly. Replace or repair damaged or worn parts before using the dolly.
- Use the dolly on flat and level surfaces capable of supporting the dolly and its maximum load. Pulling or pushing a load on a slanted or uneven surface can result in loss of control.
- Do not modify the dolly in any way. Unauthorized modification may impair the function and/or safety and could affect the life of the equipment. There are specific applications for which the dolly was designed.

Assembly Instructions

- Attach the lower end of the brace (#16) to the axle assembly (#11) using a bolt (#6), a flat washer (#3), and a nut (#4).
- Connect the axle assembly (#11), T-Bar handle (#2), upper end of the brace (#16), and the lower end of the mounting support (#5) together using a bolt (#17), a flat washer (#3), and a nut (#4).
- Attach the upper end of the mounting support (#5) onto the T-Bar handle (#2) using a bolt (#18), a flat washer (#3), and a nut (#4).
- Attach the 8" Flat Free Swivel Caster (#7) to the mounting support (#5) using a bolt (#6), a flat washer (#3), and a nut (#4).
- Install the coupler ball (#15) onto the adjustable tube (#14) and then insert the adjustable tube (#14) into the axle assembly (#11). Secure them with a pin (#12) and an R pin (#13)
- Attach the two tires (#9) to the axle assembly (#11) and secure them with flat washers (#8) and a split pin (#10).
- Check and tighten all hardware as needed.
- Adjust the tube (#14) to the proper height for your trailer. Make sure the pin (#12) is secured through the adjustable tube and the welded tube on the frame.
- Place the R-pin (#13) into the hole of the pin (#12).


Maintenance

Maintain the dolly by adopting a program of conscientious repair and maintenance in accordance with the following recommended procedures. It is recommended that the general condition of any tool be

examined before it is used. Keep your tool in good repair. Keep handles dry, clean, and free from oil and grease. The following chart is based on a normal operation schedule.

Maintenance Interval	Maintenance Point
Daily before operating	Maintain your dolly. It is recommended that the general condition of any dolly be examined before it is used. Keep your dolly in good repair by adopting a program of conscientious repair and maintenance. Have necessary repairs made by qualified service personnel.

Limited Warranty

("We" or "Us") warrants to the original purchaser only ("You" or "Your") that the Ultra-Tow product purchased will be free from material defects in both materials and workmanship, normal wear and tear excepted, for a period of <u>one year</u> from date of purchase. The foregoing warranty is valid only if the installation and use of the product is strictly in accordance with product instructions. There are no other warranties, express or implied, including the warranty of merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose. If the product does not comply with this limited warranty, Your sole and exclusive remedy is that We will, at our sole option and within a commercially reasonable time, either replace the product or product component without charge to You or refund the purchase price (less shipping). This limited warranty is not transferable.

Limitations on the Warranty

This limited warranty does not cover: (a) normal wear and tear; (b) damage through abuse, neglect, misuse, or as a result of any accident or in any other manner; (c) damage from misapplication, overloading, or improper installation; (d) improper maintenance and repair; and (e) product alteration in any manner by anyone other than Us, with the sole exception of alterations made pursuant to product instructions and in a workmanlike manner.

Obligations of Purchaser

You must retain Your product purchase receipt to verify date of purchase and that You are the original purchaser. To make a warranty claim, contact Us at 1-800-222-5381, identify the product by make and model number, and follow the claim instructions that will be provided. The product and the purchase receipt must be provided to Us in order to process Your warranty claim. Any returned product that is replaced or refunded by Us becomes our property. You will be responsible for return shipping costs or costs related to Your return visit to a retail store.

Remedy Limits

Product replacement or a refund of the purchase price is Your sole remedy under this limited warranty or any other warranty related to the product. We shall not be liable for: service or labor charges or damage to Your property incurred in removing or replacing the product; any damages, including, without limitation, damages to tangible personal property or personal injury, related to Your improper use, installation, or maintenance of the product or product component; or any indirect, incidental or consequential damages of any kind for any reason.

Assumption of Risk

You acknowledge and agree that any use of the product for any purpose other than the specified use(s) stated in the product instructions is at Your own risk.

Governing Law

This limited warranty gives You specific legal rights, and You also may have other rights which vary from state to state. This limited warranty is governed by the laws of the State of Minnesota, without regard to rules pertaining to conflicts of law.
